1 Tiger Wests Athlete made it to 2024 LANSW Youth State Championships for 2 events! This is again a solid conversion from Regional, and one we will look to keep up.

The work of the parents and athletes and helped by consistent running of competition all culminated in these great results.

Treasurer's Report for 2022-23

We ended the year with a surplus of \$670 and a final balance of \$10,371. In round numbers, registrations were \$3,694 compared with \$4,055 last year (which included \$1,270 vouchers). We received a grant of \$2,148 which we used to purchase new high jump equipment. Overall income was up by \$1,541 and expenses were up by \$2,817.

After expenses, barbecue sales (including for a dog show!) brought in \$1,810. Uniform sales raised \$490. The only uniforms we bought were for club representatives, and they cost \$389. We have quite a stock of uniforms but will need to order more of the smaller sizes. Trophies cost \$1,009.

The Tyro card reader has continued to be very convenient at barbecues and for uniform purchases – both for families and the treasurer.

I am grateful to Bryan Pevely for reviewing the accounts.
